



The Monk, Sataun, & Simpson  
Sep: 21: 1865.



Darling, I was ill of the 17 with the  
fever from New Sea - and in bed on my  
arrival last night - I really thank my physician  
for although I hope it might be a little piece  
of me - I am Darling only - and when all is well  
with me - my heart is calmer & happier - You  
must know of my misadventure - since my last  
on Monday morning at Godalme I took some  
fruit & vegetables & the maid ran to the station & had  
them off to London - thus we had a necessity of  
settling up accounts - & I being much distressed at  
the matter I went to the bank to attend to some  
last matter of mine with the saddle - & then  
up to the station - I left the carriage for Leeds - & after  
at Skipton - I was left by my - & as I had before  
arranged - carriage & horses to drive in my child  
from Skipton to Bolton - but when we stopped and  
Sept. & the next day Tuesday - a foggy day - we  
took a carriage & drove to the shed to Barden Town  
& then back to Bolton Abbey - which we enjoyed  
my much - I was ill of the party which was  
it a great pleasure - the air was delicious - & I felt  
so my much better lighter & happier - that I was  
comforted beyond every thing - to be able to  
think that my suffering of the last Thursday  
especially - was perhaps to be attributed as much  
to the Iron water which I had been taking - as to the  
wounded pride & wounded vanity & hurt affection  
which I had with the  
horses - thus we shall never be  
- said & I shall have them to go  
stronger on the way - God bless  
for my dearish child & trust of  
Darling - I am ever your  
fondly devoted

 I find my self dreadfully hysterical & am

 sea found I had lost a pound of flesh - & felt very  
 low & weak - that I could see no prospect of

 think waiting a day or two for me. I want you  
 I Paris with me - & then we can travel together  
 he would be a help to me & I should be a profit  
 to you. I did want to go to Rome soon - I have  
 a little from Rome - your boxes some of them had a  
 & want to put to get them through the custom  
 without opening or sending to you for the keys.  
 My horse had all been ill - with the malady  
 of which poor pony died. but now getting better  
 Rome perfectly healthy - no cholera. I was told  
 that I shall be glad for you now to get them by  
 me. I as did has no occasion to stop in Florence  
 & would like to do so - we can then accom-  
 modate matters very well. I would give the horse  
 a more fatiguing journey - but perhaps as did not  
 be with them (Saints I am sorry for as well as I  
 he will be even safer & a little expensiver in the choice  
 of the shaman made - Betty has been - would take  
 to them a great favour - but at a cost of 40 per  
 each. I spending a boy - at a cost of 12 pounds  
 all the provisions & means passap 12 pounds  
 to by the Neapolitan way - I can send them from  
 wa directly back to Marseille - 25 to Lanta Trechin  
 so but if you can send them that way - they must be  
 in North Tunis - for I want send horse through the  
 Ca of Bencay a - 10 day passap to Liphorn - at a cost  
 of 50 each. I did not know any business  
 do tell me what I ask. This is so important I wish  
 I had not done your darling - to the depth of  
 heart - don't mistake what I am suffering now - the  
 love for & determination to hold any other nor not  
 of the slightest degree touch my love & devotion for & to  
 I am in the death & distress of my being.

Dear my darling. darling baby from  
 I don't know to 'sickness as I think  
 want you both more than long  
 can be - but I find my self feeling  
 so poorly - & the news I got of the  
 being so poor in Paris & other con-  
 tinent generally - makes me & had  
 any exposure - until I can feel a  
 little stronger for my journey &  
 my walk in Rome - find this  
 I send for me from our carriage  
 to do as I have proposed about  
 the journey I did say with the  
 horse - then we shall remember to  
 - and I shall have them to go  
 strong on the way - God smiles  
 for my dearish that I trust of  
 darling - I am sent you  
 fondly devoted
