

Mount Mans. Boston

Dear Mr. Crow

Arrived last night from the
 White Mountain. I found you favour of the
 6" with af enclosed. many many thanks
 for this & all other kindnesses rec'd at your
 hands. Enclosed please find a letter from
 Mr Macalister rectifying mistake to which I
 referred in my last letter to you. I have instructed
 him to place the last balance with Smart
 Brother to your credit - which with the 24. you
 are kind enough to allow me will leave me
 something about \$12,903.76 in your hands.
 If Mr Hitchcock is fortunate enough to place
 the \$10,000 as you have hoped - perhaps you
 will find another instrument for \$3,000 & add
 the remainder yourself in anticipation of
 reimbursing myself from my next paym^{ts}

of interest from Liberty bonds. You will per-
-haps burthen your self still further & place
me under renewed & increasing obligations
by looking out for something for me - in which
to invest the amount which you will receive
from W Macaheten letter - will be incoming
in "October next" - & October of 1861. - with the
\$2000 Cash. Perhaps it will be as well to let
the Balance you will now hold on Labor
the \$1000 - rest in your hands uninvested with
the \$2000 Cash. is paid: thus making an in-
-vestment in round numbers \$5000. unless
something more favourable offers for the
smaller sum. By the end of October I hope
to be able to make still further remittances
to you - & only hope I may not incur the risk
of being troublesome to you:

I am so glad to hear you find the girls
improved. Certainly they wished you might
do so. They seem, by their letters, to be so

happy to see you again. Emma wants
me you are off to Lenox today - a bad day
for your journey - perhaps you have not
started - Expecting that you would not
be away from New York so soon. I have
made my arrangements not to be able to

the price - thus she will be away to Rome
Earlin. which she seems to desire. whether
she gets the Arago - or some other steamer.
"Anything floating" - she says. I sincerely
hope I may not miss seeing you in Lenox
& would be a very serious disappointment
to me to lose my chance of seeing Emma
before she leaves for the West.
